Position Overview

Visiting Archaeologists are professional archaeologists or those with substantial experience in archaeological methods, including excavation, and public communication of past human lifeways. Visiting Archaeologists will support the Indian Writings program by providing guidance and mentoring to the seasonal "Backcountry Archaeology Specialist" on best practices for excavation and lab methods. You will assist the Indian Writings Camp Director and Backcountry Archaeology Specialist with the delivery of the archaeological program to participants for one to two weeks. Your work will focus on the excavation area, lab, artifact curation, record keeping, and archaeological interpretation. Interacting wth the Visiting Archaeologists is an important learning experience for Philmont participants. The objective is to inspire Scouts and the backcountry staff with an understanding of archaeological methods, ethics, and the value of the past for the present.

Primary Duties & Responsibilities

- Become thoroughly familiar with the Indian Writings program, history of archaeological work at the camp, and the human history of the Philmont area
- Under the direction of the Camp Director, continue on-the-job training for the camp's Backcountry
 Archaeology Specialist, ensuring accuracy of information provided to participants and demonstrating
 professional, responsible stewardship of archaeological resources
- Under the direction of the Camp Director and Archaeology Specialist, assist with delivering an engaging and informative archaeology program to participants, primarily focused on the work and program related to archaeological investigations (e.g., excavation, rock art recording), the archaeology lab (e.g., artifact curation,

record keeping), and archaeological interpretation of the human history of the area, at scheduled program times

- Follow all procedures for excavation, recording, and artifact curation established by the Visiting Archaeologist Coordinators and Philmont management
- In collaboration with the Archaeologist Specialist, maintain a clean, organized, and safe archaeological program and work environment and the proper use, security, and care of program equipment
- Ensure materials and supplies are stocked and in working order; report any needs to the Camp Director and/or the Visiting Archaeologist Coordinators
- Compile and share notes during your experience with the Camp Director, Archaeology Specialist, and Visiting Archaeologist Coordinators to further enhance the future of the program
- Assist with any additional staff reponsibilities at Indian Writings as directed by the Camp Director and as able
- Complete other duties as assigned by direct supervisor or ranch management as required

Desired Qualifications & Experience

- Training and/or experience in archaeological methods including excavation required
- Excellent communication and presentation skills required
- Previous Philmont staff or participant experience preferred
- Teaching experience preferred

Physical Requirements & Work Environment

- Must meet Scouting America height/weight requirements.
- Be able to lift and handle materials potentially up to 50 pounds
- Frequent movement over rugged terrain to access all areas of camp location including hiking and climbing stairs. The excavation area is an eighth of a mile from camp and will require hiking to/from the area daily.
- Exposed to various outdoor weather conditions
- Based in remote locations with little to no cell service, internet, or other amenities
